## INTERACTION

Small group work

## AIM

The aim of this game is to review the grammar covered in Units 1 and 2 of the *Skyline 4* Student's Book.

## TIME

15–20 minutes

## GRAMMAR

Indirect questions

Zero, first and second conditionals

The passive voice

Relative clauses

## PREPARATION

Photocopy and cut out one set of the cards for each group. If possible, use a different color or mark the back of the cards *B* or *E* to show which are beginnings and endings.

## AIM OF THE GAME

Each set of cards contains 12 pairs, which match up to form correct sentences. The idea of the game is for the cards to be placed face down on the table in front of the students. Each student then takes a turn turning over one (*B*) card and one (*E*) card. If the two cards form a correct sentence, the student keeps the pair of cards. If not, the student turns the cards back over in the same place on the table and it is the next student's turn. The winner is the student with the most cards at the end of the game. By watching the other students, they can remember where parts of the sentences are.

## PROCEDURE

- 1 Divide the class into groups of five or six.
- 2 Throw a dice. The person with the highest number starts.
- 3 The first player turns over two cards and shows them to the rest of the group.
- 4 If the sentences make a correct sentence, the player keeps the cards. If not, the player replaces the cards in the same place on the table.
- 5 The next player does the same.
- 6 The game continues until there are no more cards left on the table.
- 7 The winner is the person with the most cards.

**Note:** The students should look at the punctuation in the second part of the sentences carefully.
